**November is National Diabetes Month** Every 17 seconds someone is diagnosed with diabetes, a disease which kills more people each year than breast cancer and AIDS combined. Holy Name of Jesus Parish is hosting **Life Line Screening, the nation’s leading provider of preventive health screenings on Friday, November 4, 2016.** One of the tests is a simple blood test for glucose (sugar) which can determine if a person is at-risk of developing diabetes.
